The testimony of the principal witnesses is corroborated by the affidavits of Mr. CLEARY and W. J. HALL, both Southerners.

The counsel for the defence admitted the evidence, but contended that there was no decided authority in support of the prosecution for conspiricy to murder in a foreign country, and that it was not punishable by the common law in England, unless it was contemplated to murder the head of a government.

was one of many Canadians who fought for Lincoln

An estimated **30,000 to 50,000 English and French Canadians** enlisted in the Civil War—overwhelmingly on the Union side.

As many as 5 to 10 percent of some regiments in Maine, Massachusetts and Michigan were francophones.

The Canadians fought valiantly: at least twenty-nine earned Medals of Honour; five of them became Union generals.

And many paid the ultimate price for valour: an estimated **5,000 to 7,000 died.**


The Montreal Gazette, November 24, 1959:


